Using the Android Keyboard

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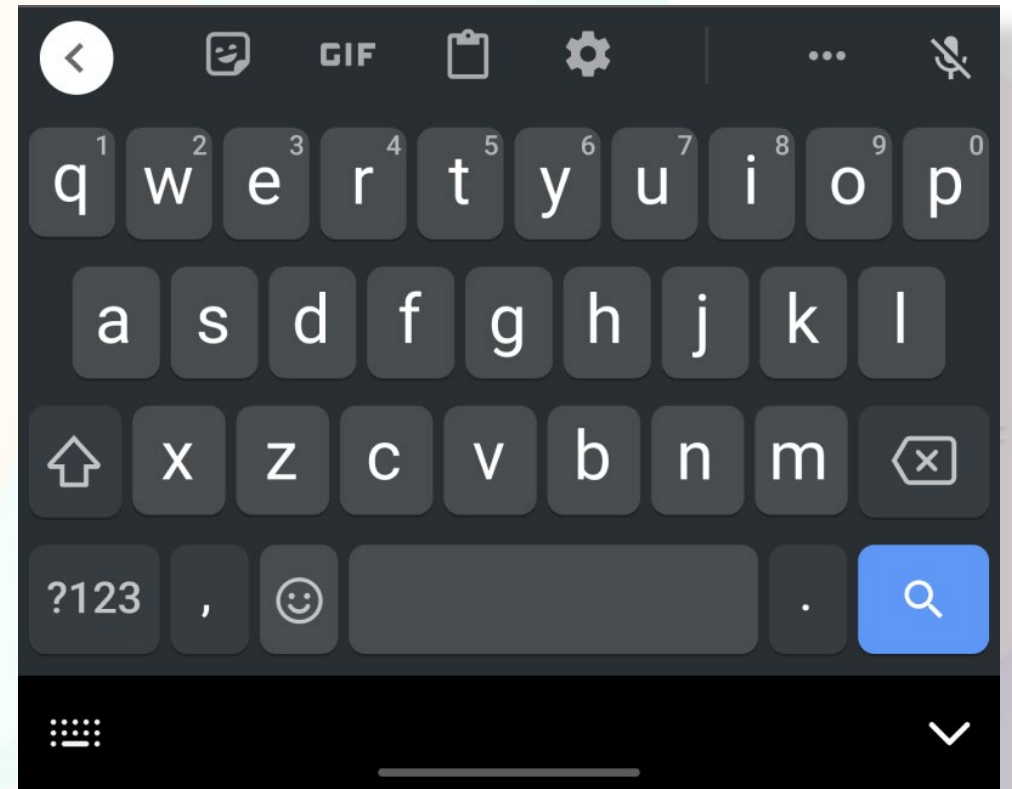
Last week, we learned how to ***tap, pinch*** and ***scroll*** on our screens

But what happens when we want to ***type words?***

Using the Android Keyboard

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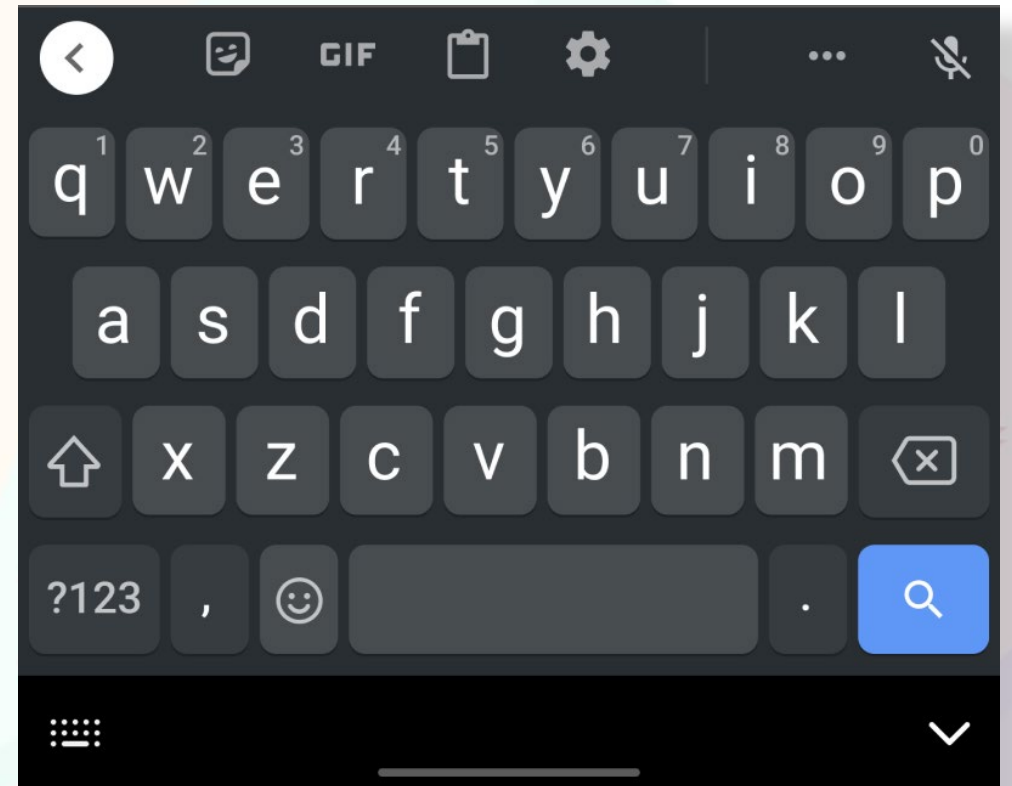
To do that, we will
need the **keyboard!**



The On-Screen Keyboard

- ❓ There's a keyboard **built into every tablet and smartphone.**
- ❓ The keyboard **appears on the touch screen.**
- ❓ To save screen space, the keyboard **only appears when there's somewhere to type.**

Icons on the Internet

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Let's look at some of the new **icons** you'll see when you're **online**:



Wi-Fi

| Shows **internet connection strength**



Browser/Internet

| Opens the **web browser**



Search

| Lets you **search for information**



Back

| Lets you **return to the previous page**



Tabs

| **Shows all open webpages** on the browser



Bookmark

| **Saves a webpage** to return to later



What is Wi-Fi?

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Wi-Fi is a *wireless* connection that lets your device **access the internet**.

You can get **Wi-Fi** from the following:

- At **home** (through internet companies like *Rogers* or *Bell*)
- In **public places** (like *coffee shops*, *libraries*, and *hospitals*)

Wi-fi doesn't use **data** from a **phone plan**.

Home Wi-Fi vs. Public Wi-Fi

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Home Wi-Fi

- ☐ **Faster** — compared to public
- ☐ **Safer** — password protected by you
- ☐ **Not time limited** — You can stay connected as long as you are home.



Public Wi-Fi

- ☐ **Free** — no cost to you!
- ☐ **Slower** — more people are connected
- ☐ **Convenient** — Great for browsing, viewing maps, and watching videos.

Wi-Fi Safety Tip

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Public Wi-Fi is great for *browsing the internet, checking maps or watching videos.*

For **personal things** like *online banking* or *accessing medical information*, it's better to wait to use your **home Wi-Fi**, or to use **cellular data**.



This isn't meant to scare you — it's just **good to know!**



What is Cellular Data?

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- ❖ **Cellular Data** (Data) comes from a **phone plan you buy** from companies like **Koodo, Freedom, Rogers, Telus**, etc.
- ❖ **Data connects you** to the internet *anywhere your phone has a signal* (cellular service).
- ❖ Data lets you **access the internet without** using **Wi-Fi**.

When Might You Use Data?

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- ❖ Using **Google Maps** when you are out on the street
- ❖ **Checking your email** when you are taking the bus home
- ❖ **Searching for something** on the internet when you are out
- ❖ **Watching videos** or **searching online** on the go

Wi-Fi vs. Data: Quick Comparison

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— Wi-Fi —

- Can access at **home** *or* in **public spaces**
- Works **only where** there is **Wi-Fi is available**
- Best for **watching videos & downloading files**

— Data —

- Part of your **phone plan** (limited amount)
- Works ***almost* anywhere** (spotty in rural areas)
- Good for **quick internet tasks** on the go

Let's Practice:

1. Find the **settings app** on the tablet
2. Open **settings**
3. Tap **Wi-Fi**
4. Choose *CAMH Guest Wi-Fi*
5. Enter the **Wi-Fi password** (see whiteboard)

7. Try **visiting a webpage** to confirm it works

What is the Internet?

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The **Internet** is a **giant network** of **connected computers** that share information.

When you *look up a recipe, watch a video, check a map, or read the news*, you're **using the internet**.

What is an Internet Browser?

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An **Internet Browser** (Browser) is the tool that lets you **open** and **look at web pages on the internet**.

Think of it like a door that helps you *enter different websites and view different webpages.*



What is an Internet Browser?

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Common internet browsers include:



Google Chrome:

commonly used on android devices and **the one used in DOORS Canada**



Microsoft Edge:

commonly used on Microsoft products



Safari:

commonly used on Apple devices



Firefox:

Another browser that can be downloaded.

What is a Search Engine?

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A **search engine** helps you **find information on the internet**.

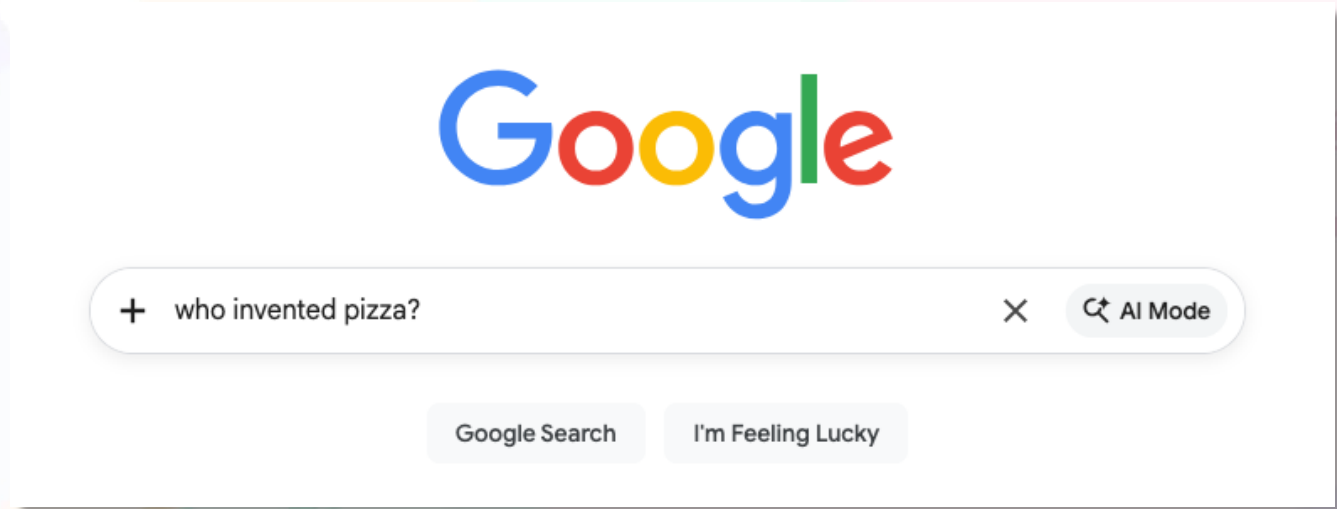
When you type in something like “*Who invented pizza?*” it **searches millions of websites** and brings back **the most relevant matches**.

What is a Search Engine?

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Examples of a search engine include:

- Google
- Bing
- DuckDuckGo



What Does the Padlock Mean?

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When you **visit a website**, you might see a **small padlock** in the **address bar**.



= **Secure Website**

- Your **information** is **protected** *and* **encrypted**
- **Safe to enter personal info**



= **Unsecure Website**

- **Don't enter passwords, email, or payment info**
- Might be **okay to read**, but **not okay to share personal info**

Let's Practice: Searching the Internet

1. Open the **Chrome App** (tap  browser icon)
2. Tap the **search bar**
3. **Type something** – or – **ask a question** and tap “*enter*”
4. **Tap one of the website results** that appears
5. Use the **back button** if the website doesn't have the information you were looking for
6. **Bookmark** the page to **save it for later!**
